We want to welcome you to the ranks of Americans who will have a role in determining the future of your country by exercising this important right, your right to vote. The results of the upcoming New Hampshire Presidential Primary in February as well as state and local elections will impact your life and future. Issues such as healthcare access and coverage, public education and postgraduate funding, renewable energy support, and continuing to make New Hampshire an attractive place to live and work are only some of the issues the Governor and Legislature will address in the coming years. Polling Location: Bedford High School Gymnasium 47 Nashua Road, Bedford 03110

Polling Hours: 7:00 am - 7:00pm

Absentee Ballots: Absentee ballot request applications are available at the Bedford Town Office Building and/or may be downloaded from the Town of Bedford website (www.bedfordnh.org/240/Town-Clerk).

The Town Office is located at 24 North Amherst Road and the hours are Monday – Friday 8:00am – 4:30pm Tuesday – 7:00am – 4:30pm.

## You will be entitled to vote by absentee ballot for the following reasons:

- You plan to be absent on the day of the election.
- You cannot appear in public on election day because of observance of a religious commitment.
- You are unable to vote in person due to a disability.
- You cannot appear at any time during polling hours because an employment obligation requires you to remain physically at work, or to be in transit to or from work from the time the polls open until after the polls close.

## What type of ID will I need to vote?

- Driver's license issued by any state or federal government
- Non-driver ID card issued by NH DMV or motor vehicle agency of another state
- Photo ID card for "voting identification only" issued by NH DMV (RSA 260:21)
- United States armed services identification card
- United States passport or passcard
- NH student ID card

Party Affiliation Changes Cutoff for party affiliation is 90 days prior to a primary election.

Registered Undeclared? DURING PRIMARY ELECTIONS ONLY you may choose a Democratic, Republican or Libertarian ballot. You then become a member of that party. To return to Undeclared, sign your name in the "undeclared book" when exiting the polls or visit the Town Office Building during regular office hours.
